6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means:

It is advantageous for the Judiciary to seek a procurement exemption for the purchase of an access control system upgrade for Hoapili Hale because like most other access control manufacturers, the system is currently provided and maintained by one system integrator in the State of Hawaii. The system integrator has set standardized pricing for addition/expansions to the system and they currently provide and maintain all of the locations integrated into the system. In order to remain integrated and reduce our expense for the system, we will need to install the system equipment and have it programmed into the existing system by the system integrator that maintains the system. As the system was originally chosen through a competitive bid process, we are requesting an exemption from 103-D.

7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:

Judiciary currently has the necessary licenses and software to allow this expansion of PremiSys in the Second Circuit. Security Resources Pacific, Inc. is the only integrator in Hawaii that is factory trained which allows for all conversions, modifications and maintenance of the software and hardware. The exemption request will allow Security Resources Pacific, Inc., to install the required access control system hardware in the Second Circuit to upgrade our system, increase our expandability and security at an affordable cost to the Judiciary.
