PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE LAWYERS' FUND FOR CLIENT PROTECTION OF THE SUPREME COURT OF HAWAI'I

Rule 6. CONSIDERATION OF AND PAYMENT OF CLAIMS. 6.1. When Claims Must be Filed.

Claims for reimbursement from the Fund shall not be brought later than [two (2)] 5 years after the claimant knew or should have known of the dishonest conduct of the lawyer. Claims for reimbursement, however, shall not be brought later than 2 years after a qualifying event specified in Rule 10.3(a)(3) of the Rules of the Supreme Court. Nothing herein shall preclude the trustees in the exercise of their discretion from considering a claim filed later than as provided in these rules upon good cause shown.
