Rule 2. CERTIFICATION OF COURT REPORTERS.

* * *

(b) Unless specifically exempted by order of the supreme court, [no]Hawaii certified shorthand reporters shall not file any verbatim transcripts or recordings of any trial or judicial proceeding in any of the courts of the State of Hawai'i, or any transcripts or recordings of any oral depositions taken in Hawai'i, for use in the courts of this state, [shall be accepted for filing unless signed and certified by a Hawai'i certified shorthand reporter] until said reporter signs said transcript or recording, certifying it as a true and correct transcription or recording of the proceeding in question.
