6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means:

The State of Hawaii Judiciary has invested in an integrated security system which includes access control. CCTV, remote video monitoring, duress system integration, badging and intrusion detection capabilities. The system provides in house control of all aspects of the system. Like most other access control manufacturers the system is provided and maintained by one system integrator in the State of Hawaii. The system integrator has set standardized pricing for additions and expansions to the system and they currently provide and maintain all of the locations integrated into the system. In order to remain integrated and reduce our expense for the system, we will need to install the system equipment and have it programmed into the existing system by the system integrator that maintains the system. Even if another source was available for the individual components or hardware on the system, we would still need to contract with the existing system integrator to program the sites into the existing system. Based on this and the fact that the system was originally chosen through a competitive bid process, we are requesting an exemption from 103-D.

7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:

The Judiciary Oahu ITSD has a database VM server that we can access to add a duress alarm system in order to reduce the exorbitant costs associated with this type of security system upgrade. Furthermore, the Judiciary currently has the necessary licenses and software with Security Resources Pacific, Inc. to allow us to upgrade our duress alarm system via the purchase of necessary hardware. Security Resources Pacific, Inc. is the only integrator in Hawaii that is factory trained which allows for all conversions, modifications and maintenance of the software and hardware.
