It is not practicable or advantageous for the Program to procure by competitive means because Judiciary procured for Adult Substance Abuse Treatment Services (ASATS) through RFP J15068 and all eligible Providers were awarded a contract, including Care Hawaii. The additional services needed from Care Hawaii are to ensure Judiciary clients receive treatment. If CARE Hawaii does not provide these services, the existing Providers will not be able to handle the increased caseload. Our ASATS larger contracts provide primarily residential treatment services while our smaller contracts provide outpatient and intensive outpatient services along with assessments and therefore, do not have the capacity for an increased caseload. Also, CARE HAWAII has been providing superior services for cognitive interventions according to the CPC assessment.
