6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means:

It is not practicable or not advantageous to procure by competitive means because The Medical Corner is the only vendor which offers more accessible locations throughout different regions of Oahu. The Medical Corner has four (4) locations on Oahu located at the Airport Trade Center, Kailua, Kapolei and Waikiki. The Medical Corner is the only vendor who provides clinic hours on weekends, allowing services seven (7) days a week, to include a clinic in close proximity to the Detention Facility in Kapolei, which would greatly benefit due to the anticipated high utilization rate.

7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:

The Medical Corner was chosen based on the following factors which benefit the Judiciary: 1) The Medical Corner's facilities (location of clinics or offices) are located in different regions of Oahu which provides more accessibility to our employees. 2) The Medical Corner offers extended hours of operations which are necessary to the purpose and nature of the current program. The Medical Corner was the more suitable vendor to ensure the Judiciary meets the program requirements.

As an employer required program, the Judiciary must incur the cost for medical examinations; therefore, sending employees to the emergency room would greatly increase the cost to the Judiciary. Hence, the Judiciary would significantly benefit from The Medical Corner's facilities and expertise.
