- Mediates and facilitates public policy disputes referred by elected or appointed government officials
- Manages the Judiciary's Purchase of Services contract for mediation and related dispute resolution services
- Promotes alternative dispute resolution through training and education

Highlights from Fiscal Year 2012 - 2013

Programs

The Center designs and implements alternative dispute resolution programs for state and county governments to help the public avoid unnecessary litigation and encourage early and fair conflict resolution. This past year, the Center:

- Administered the Hawaii Appellate Mediation Program
- Assisted the Family Court, 1st Judicial Circuit, with the Oahu Child Welfare Mediation Program, the Volunteer Settlement Master Program, and a pilot for on-site mediation of paternity cases
- Assisted in preparing the Judiciary's application to the Department of the Attorney General for Foreclosure Assistance Program funds

Direct Services

The Center provides mediation, facilitation, and process design services for cases involving public policy. This past year, the Center:

- Provided assistance for the Judiciary's Strategic Planning process
- Consulted with and assisted other branches of state government on a variety of issues
- Facilitated a series of meetings for the Campaign Spending Commission
