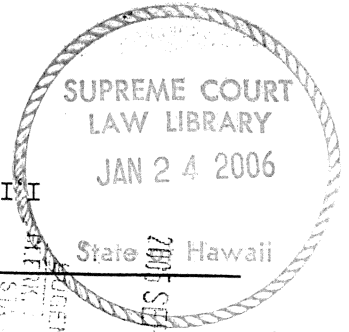

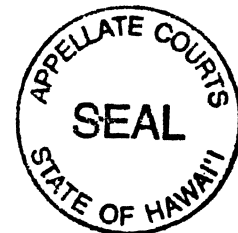
In consideration of the results of Hurricane Katrina and the displacement of lawyers in the states of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, notwithstanding Rule 1 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i, that any duly licensed Louisiana, Mississippi, or Alabama lawyer, who is in good standing with the Bar of the States of Louisiana, Mississippi, or Alabama and who is not subject to a disciplinary order from any state or jurisdiction, may associate and practice with a duly licensed Hawai'i attorney from the date of this order through March 31, 2006, subject to appropriate registration with the Hawai'i State Bar Association.
