Self-Help Centers provide free legal information to people who do not have an attorney. Volunteer attorneys can answer your questions, help you fill out forms, and explain what will happen next in your case. Self-Help Centers are located in courthouses on Oahu, Maui, Kauai and Hawai'i Island.

Free interpreter services for most languages are available by telephone at the Self-Help Centers. You should inform court staff if such help is needed.
