<p>1. Describe the goods, services or construction:</p> <p>K7136 CONTINUOUS ALCOHOL MONITORING SERVICES - transdermal 24/7 alcohol monitoring services</p>	
<p>2. Vendor/Contractor/Service Provider:</p> <p>Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc.</p>	<p>3. Amount of Request:</p> <p>not to exceed \$7,155 pending confirmation of funding</p>

<p>6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means:</p> <p>In 2012, University Health Partners of Hawaii, formerly University Clinical Education and Research Associates (UCERA), was contracted by the Judiciary to provide case management and research services for the DWI Court Program. During this year, UCERA purchased 20 SCRAM Continuous Alcohol Monitoring (CAM) bracelets and modems to monitor DWI Court Program participants at a cost of \$1,500 per bracelet and modem set. While UCERA will no longer provide services to the Judiciary after September 30, 2017, the program will retain all inventory purchased with grant funds, including the SCRAM CAM equipment. Of this initial inventory, there are 18 SCRAM CAM bracelet and modem sets are functioning and available for use. The current price quote to turn on SCRAM CAM bracelets to monitor a client is \$4.40 per day, with optional additional services at an additional cost.</p> <p>It would not be practicable or advantageous for the program to use another vendor, as the rate would be more expensive since we would have to rent or purchase their equipment in addition to the cost of daily monitoring.</p>	
<p>7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:</p> <p>SCRAM CAM from Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc. is the most widely used 24/7 transdermal alcohol testing technology. The system includes an ankle bracelet and base station, and it combines continuous alcohol testing with optional house arrest monitoring in a single device. Since 2003, SCRAM CAM has monitored 483,000+ clients in more than 1,800 jurisdictions throughout the United States. SCRAM CAM is the only evidential instrument on the market that utilizes the proven science of transdermal testing to measure alcohol consumption. And it is the only transdermal alcohol testing system that employs an active controlled sample delivery system using the industry-validated Dräger fuel cell. As a result, SCRAM CAM technology produces a quantifiable TAC curve that is able to distinguish consumed alcohol from topical or environmental sources of alcohol. Because of the controlled-sample approach, SCRAM CAM does not require a secondary confirmation process to confirm alcohol consumption, ensuring single-source admissibility for test results.</p>
