ORDER AMENDING RULE 1.17 OF THE
RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF HAWAI'I
(By: Recktenwald, C.J., Nakayama, McKenna, Pollack, and Wilson, JJ.)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Rule 1.17 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i is amended, effective immediately upon the filing of this order, as follows (deleted materials is bracketed and stricken; new material is underscored):

Rule 1.17. Limited admission of United States Uniformed Services spouse-attorneys.

(a) Eligibility. Due to the unique mobility requirements of members of the United States Uniformed Services (USUS), an attorney who is a spouse of such a service member assigned to active duty in the State of Hawai'i may be provisionally admitted as an attorney of this State, without written examination, if the following conditions are fulfilled.

(3) FORM OF LICENSE. [The license admitting the applicant shall be in the form provided by Rule 1.6 of these Rules, except that, after "is hereby" the clerk shall insert the words "licensed for practice pursuant to and subject to the terms set forth in Rule 1.17 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i" and, after "good behavior," the clerk shall insert, "until such time as, pursuant to

Rule 1.17 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i, this provisional license expires."

The license to be given to an attorney issued pursuant to this Rule 1.17 shall be in the following form:

Supreme Court of Hawai'i

, having been examined and found to be of good moral character and to possess the necessary legal and educational qualifications, is hereby licensed to practice in all the courts of the State of Hawai'i, pursuant to and subject to the terms set forth in Rule 1.17 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i, as an attorney, counselor and solicitor during good behavior, until such time as, pursuant to Rule 1.17(c) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i, this provisional license expires.

This license shall expire no later than four years from the date of issuance.
