

Serving Your Temporary Restraining Order (TRO)

Katouren noumw we TRO (ewe taropwen keimwu fesen non mochomochen fansoun)

- Your TRO will not take effect until it is granted and filed by the court. In addition, the TRO is not enforceable until it is properly served upon the respondent. Once the TRO is granted and filed, it is your responsibility to ensure that the documents are provided to the police department for proper service upon the respondent. Please take these steps if the respondent resides on the same island:

Esapw mwo poputa manamanen noumw we TRO tori a punguno me fael seni imwen kapuung pwan tori an ewe iir mei atipisi epwe angei ewe taropwen, TRO. Nupwen ewe TRO a punguno me pwan fael, epwene pusin omw sekining an ekkewe taropwe epwe tour ngeni ewe putain ponis aar repwe atoura ngeni ewe iir mei atipisi. Ikkei met kopwe fori ika ewe iir mei atipisi mei nomw won ewe fenú ka pwan nonomw won:

1. Go to the police station in the same area where the respondent resides and provide the police department with two copies of the TRO.
Feino non ewe ponis station a nomw non ewe kinikin ikewe ia ewe iir mei atipisi a nonomw ie. Pwan awara ngeni ewe putain ponis ruwacho kapin ewe TRO.
2. On Oahu, if you do not wish to drop off the documents to the police department and if the respondent's address is known, you may request to have your TRO documents emailed to the police department for service upon the respondent.
Won Oahu, ika pwe kose mochen pusin wano ekkewe taropwe ngeni ewe putain ponis ika en mi pwan sinei address-in imwen ewechon uu ngeni alluk, ka pwan tongeni tingor kopwe chok email-ini noumw kewe taropwen TRO ngeni ewe putain ponis faniten aar repwe atoura ngeni ewechon uu ngeni alluk.
3. In all cases, provide the police department with as much information as possible as to the addresses where the respondent can be located and the times you would expect the respondent to be at those addresses.
Esinesin ngeni ewe putain ponis, non keukun sineiomw an ewechon uu ngeni alluk address ian repwe tongeni churi me ia. Pwan esinei ngenir kunokun ika fansoun ke ekieki nge ewechon uu ngeni alluk epwe nomw non ewe neni.
4. Then check with the police department to find out when and if the respondent was served.
Mwirin ka tongeni cheki omw kopwe sinei ika ewe putain ponis ra atoura ekkewe taropwe ngeni ewechon uu ngeni alluk.

- In the event the respondent resides on another island or outside the State of Hawai'i, you will need to contact law enforcement in that location to personally serve the TRO documents on the respondent. You will then need to make sure that the proof of service document has been filed with the court after the respondent has been served.

Nge ika pwe ewechon uu ngeni alluk a nonomw won ew ekkewe fonuen me nukun Oahu ika nukun ewe State of Hawai'i, kopwene pusin kokori ekkewe putain ponis non ena neni aar repwe pusin atoura ekkewe taropwen TRO ngeni ewechon uu ngeni alluk. Mwirin ewe

taropwen TRO a tori ewe chon uu ngeni alluk, kopwe pwan awora ngeni ewe imwen kapung taropwen pwarata pwe ekkewe taropwe a tour ngeni ewe chon uu ngeni alluk.
