

Serving Your Temporary Restraining Order (TRO)

Wewin An Jerbal TRO Eo Am

Your TRO will not take effect until it is granted and filed by the court. In addition, the TRO is not enforceable until it is properly served upon the respondent. Once the TRO is granted and filed, it is your responsibility to ensure that the documents are provided to the police department for proper service upon the respondent. Please take these steps if the respondent resides on the same island:

TRO eo am ejamin jino jermal nan ne emoj an court komelimi im file e. Bareinwot TRO eo eban jino jermal nan ne emoj lelok nan armij eo abnono eo ej nae. Elane emoj komelim TRO eo im file e, kwe eo koj lolorjake bwe aolep pepa kein raurok ren etal nan ibben policeman ro bwe ren kab lelok nan armij eo abnono eo ej nae. Jouj im kommani men kein elane armij eo abnono eo ej nae ej jokwe wot ilo ailin eo.

1. Go to the police station in the same area where the respondent resides and provide the police department with two copies of the TRO.
Etal nan mon policeman eo ijo armij eo abnono eo ej komman nae ej jokwe ie im lelok ruo copy in TRO eo nan mon policeman.
 2. On Oahu, if you do not wish to drop off the documents to the police department and if the respondent's address is known, you may request to have your TRO documents emailed to the police department for service upon the respondent.

 3. In all cases, provide the police department with as much information as possible as to the addresses where the respondent can be located and the times you would expect the respondent to be at those addresses.
Ilo aolep case ko, kajeon lelok aolep melele ko remaron jiban nan policeman ro ikijen aolep ijoko armij eo abnono eo ej komman nae emaron bed ie im awa ta ko emaron bed ijoko.
 4. Then check with the police department to find out when and if the respondent was served.
Innem lale mon policeman naat eo ak elane emoj lelok pepa ko nan armij eo abnono eo ej nae.
- In the event the respondent resides on another island or outside the State of Hawai'i, you will need to contact law enforcement in that locale to personally serve the TRO documents on the respondent. You will then need to make sure that the proof of service document has been filed with the court after the respondent has been served.
