SECOND AMENDED EMERGENCY ORDER #4 REGARDING FAMILY COURT OF THE THIRD CIRCUIT

This matter comes before the Court in light of the public health emergency in the State of Hawai'i.

Pursuant to the Orders of Chief Justice Mark E. Recktenwald filed March 16, 2020, Order Directing Courthouse Closures filed March 20, 2020, Order Regarding Trials filed April 17, 2020, Order Regarding Remote Court Procedures filed April 24, 2020, and Order Regarding Judiciary Operations filed April 27, 2020 under SCMF No. 20-0000152 regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19) and with authority as Interim Chief Judge of the above-entitled Court, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- The following Family Court essential calendars shall continue to be conducted:
 - a. Temporary Restraining Orders ("TROs");
 - b. Gun Violence Protective Orders;
 - c. Shelter hearings;
 - d. Detention hearings;
 - e. Involuntary hospitalization (civil commitment) hearings;
 - f. Emergency guardianships;
 - g. Uncontested guardianships (minor and incapacitated adults) by stipulations of the parties to video/telephonic hearings;
 - h. Uncontested adoptions by stipulation of the parties to video/telephonic hearings;
 - i. Child Welfare Services Cases, including initial and continued temporary foster custody and initial and continued temporary family supervision hearings and motions when a child is removed from family supervision to foster custody, but excluding Termination of Parental Right trials and any FC-S case as allowed by Memorandum dated April 7, 2020 attached as Exhibit 1, but excluding contested Termination of Parental Right trials.
- 2. The following Family Court calendars will be continued until after May 29, 2020 or to a date after the termination of the state of emergency as declared by Governor Ige, whichever is sooner:
 - a. Divorce (all matters except for motions for relief to be considered on a case by case basis by the court and to the extent feasible, proceedings involving pre-and post-decree motions that can be heard using video conference or telephone conference);

- b. Paternity (all matters except for motions for relief to be considered on a cases by case basis by the court and to the extent feasible, proceedings involving pre-and post-decree motions that can be heard using video conference or telephone conference);
- c. Contested Guardianships (minor and incapacitated adults), excluding emergency guardianships
- d. Contested Adoptions;
- e. Assisted Community Treatment ("ACT");
- f. Any hearings as determined by the Court except for essential hearings as evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the court to the extent feasible, proceedings that can be heard using video conference or telephone conference;
- g. Non-custody juvenile matters such as disposition hearings, further disposition and review hearings, arraignment matters, trials and school non-attendance hearings;
- h. Child Welfare Services trials; and
- All Specialty Court hearings, including Juvenile Drug Court, Family Drug Court, Imua Kakou, and Truancy Court;
- j. Miscellaneous proceedings, UCCJEA & UIFS proceedings;
- The Kids First and Children in Transition programs are suspended until after May 29, 2020, or to a date after the termination of the state of emergency as declared by Governor Ige, whichever is sooner;
- 4. The following Family Court Adult Criminal Division calendars will continue to be conducted:
 - a. Bail hearings;
 - b. Orders for temporary hospitalization;

- c. Motions to revoke conditional release; and
- d. Initial appearance and preliminary hearings in felony cases.
- 5. All other matters in the Family Court Adult Criminal Division, including all trials, are continued until after May 29, 2020, or to a date after the termination of the state of emergency as declared by Governor Ige, whichever is sooner.
