

Hospital (HSH), and/or the Honolulu Police Department (HPD) will proceed as scheduled.

- B. All criminal and criminal traffic cases involving defendants who are not in the custody of OCCC, HSH, and/or HPD will be postponed until after May 29, 2020.

2. As to the mental health calendar, and concerning matters under Hawai'i Revised Statutes Chapter 704, hearings on (1) Order for Temporary Hospitalization; (2) Motion to Revoke Conditional Release; and (3) any essential hearings will proceed as scheduled. All other hearings shall be postponed until after May 29, 2020.

3. As to felony matters:

- A. All initial appearances in felony matters will proceed as usual.
- B. All preliminary hearings in felony matters will proceed as usual.

4. As to the district court specialty courts:

- A. All DWI Court hearings will be postponed until after May 29, 2020.
- B. All Community Outreach Court hearings will be postponed until after May 29, 2020.

5. The following shall apply to all district court civil proceedings:


- A. All trials will be postponed until after May 29, 2020.
- B. All answers, returnables, hearings, motions, pretrial conferences, status conferences, and settlement conferences will be postponed until after May 29, 2020.
- C. All district court temporary restraining order matters under Haw. Rev. Stat. § 604-10.5 will proceed as usual. Temporary restraining orders based on illegal lockouts and utility shutoffs will also proceed as usual.

6. All in-person traffic infraction cases will be postponed until after May 29, 2020. Traffic infraction cases in which defendants have submitted written statements in lieu of an in-person hearing under Haw. Rev. Stat. § 291D-8 shall proceed as usual.

7. The Deputy Chief Judge of the District Court, First Circuit, may issue additional orders and adjust court operations consistent with this Order and the Orders issued by Chief Justice Recktenwald in SCMF No. 20-0000152, *In re the Judiciary's Response to the COVID-19 Outbreak*.

It is so Ordered.
