Permitted Activities Include



Working at an essential business to provide essential products and services.



Tasks essential to health and safety of family and households.



Caring for family members or pets in another household.



Obtaining food, medicine, safety, and sanitation supplies.



Exercising outdoors while practicing social distancing (stay six feet away from others).

Critical Activities

include, but are not limited to:

- Banks and financial institutions
- Transportation providers, such as cabs, ridesharing operations, Biki bikeshare
- Car repair facilities and towing services
- Building and construction trades
- Landscaping to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation
- Cleaning services
- Electrical services
- Delivery of goods to stores and businesses
- Medical and health care operations
- Grocery and convenience stores
- Firearm and ammunition suppliers
- Pawn brokers
- Legal or accounting services
- Restaurants
- Pool cleaning and other sanitation services
- Farmers markets (not located at a closed facility or City property)
- Self-storage facilities
- Licensed medical marijuana dispensaries
- Moving and relocation services
- Essential businesses
- Laundromats and dry cleaners
- Farms and agricultural productions

NOT Critical Activities

include, but are not limited to:

- Barbershops, hair salons, and beauty parlors
- In-person church group gatherings
- Jewelry stores
- Liquor stores
- Car detailing and other car accessories
- Breweries
- Car sales
- In-person supports group meetings
- Florists (wholesale and retail)
- Realtors
- Tobacco and Vape shops
- Furniture stores
- Clothing stores
- Tattoo parlors
- Fitness establishments

It is at the discretion of the employer as to who is an essential worker at an essential business, and who is able to work from home. However, businesses are not required to remain open.
