



possible. Parties are encouraged to appear via Zoom. If a party is unable to appear via Zoom, the party may appear in person. Failure to appear may result in default or dismissal.

31. No person shall enter any Judiciary facility in the First Circuit if that person has: (i) a fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, or other symptoms of respiratory illness or of COVID-19 as set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (“CDC”); (ii) had close prolonged contact with a person who has or is suspected to have COVID-19; or (iii) traveled outside of Hawai‘i in the past 10 or 14 days (as applicable based on the date of arrival) and have not satisfied the negative test exception to the mandatory self-quarantine period (based on the date of arrival), subject to any subsequent out-of-state travel restrictions imposed through Statewide or County emergency orders, rules, or proclamations.

Furthermore, any person entering any Judiciary facility shall wear an appropriate face covering as described and recommended by the CDC (both inside and outside the courtroom), unless exempt, and shall maintain appropriate social distancing of at least six feet while visiting Judiciary facilities (both inside and outside the courtroom).
