ANY VIOLATION OF THIS TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER IS A MISDEMEANOR AND PUNISHABLE BY A JAIL SENTENCE OF UP TO ONE YEAR AND/OR UP TO A \$1,000 FINE.
