*Pursuant to HRS § 103D -102 (b)(4) and HAR Chapter 3-120, The Judiciary requests a procurement exemption for the following:*

Describe the goods, services or construction: To install camera hardware and software for the Judiciary ' s Integrated Security Camera Surveillance and Recording System (System) at Ali'iolani Hale. The Judiciary shall front the costs of this project from its operating budget which will then be reimbursed back to the supreme court fiscal office by way of a federal grant. See Section 6 below.</p>

<p>6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means: In September of 2016, the Judiciary was awarded a \$175,000 grant from the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) through the State Department of Defense (DOD), to begin Phase I of the installation of the System at the Kapuaiwa Building. In September of 2018, the Judiciary was awarded \$200,000 for Phase II of the Kapuaiwa Building. Both phases were managed by the DAGS. In March of 2020, the Kapuaiwa Building was completed at a cost of approximately \$140,000, leaving a remaining balance of \$60,000. In September of 2020, the Judiciary was awarded \$150,000 from HSGP for Phase III which will continue the project at Ali'iolani Hale. Part of the remaining balance of \$60,000 will be used to supplement the new grant by installing camera hardware and software within the building.  SRP was awarded the contract from DAGS to install the cameras and all related software for Phases I &amp; II. SRP possesses intimate knowledge and the expertise necessary to effectively install and integrate the new hardware and software to the existing System. In addition, SRP is the only company in Hawai'i authorized, certified and trained to service and maintain the software associated to the System. SRP currently holds the maintenance contract for the System and has consistently performed well during service and repair work since 2006.</p>	
<p>7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider: In May 2004, an Invitation for Bid (IFB) was issued for the installation of the Wireless Proximity Access Identification Card System (WPAICs) for Ali'iolani Hale, which is closely integrated into the above System. Judiciary IFB Contract J04279 was awarded to the lowest Bidder, Sensormatic Hawaii (SH), with the Notice to Proceed dated July 2004. During the installation phase, SH was disqualified for deficiencies in performance and non compliance with the minimum required specifications of the Contract. In June 2005, the second lowest bidder (SRP) was retained to complete the project, which was then expanded to include the Kapuaiwa Building in February 2006. SRP has been the service provided ever since.</p>
