



NOTICE TO DEFENDANT OF ONLINE DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Plaintiff must serve this Notice to the Defendant along with the Statement of Claim and Notice of Hearing.

You have received this Notice because:

- The Plaintiff whose name is listed in the Statement of Claim has filed a case against you in Small Claims.
- You are the Defendant in this case. If you have an attorney, give this Notice to your attorney along with the Statement of Claim.

Registration Required

This case is included in the Hawai'i State Judiciary Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) Pilot Program. **You MUST register on the online system within 14 days** of being served with the Statement of Claim.

You must have access to a computer or mobile device, a connection to the internet and an e-mail address.

If you do not have access to the necessary technology, you may submit a request to be exempted from participating in ODR. Please use the Request for Exemption from Small Claims ODR Pilot Project form. If you are excused from participating, you will be required to submit your court documents directly with the court in person or via U.S. mail and appear at the scheduled hearing.

How Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) works.

- Instead of going to trial at the courthouse, you and the Plaintiff may negotiate between yourselves or work with a third party neutral, a mediator, to reach an agreed resolution of your dispute using the online system.
- The system can be accessed at any time using a computer, tablet or smart phone with internet connection. You will receive email and or text messages during the course of the online negotiation/mediation process to notify you when to log back into the system.
