Section 6:

Approval is respectfully requested for an exemption from Chapter 103D, HRS, to acquire the professional services of Security Resources Pacific, Incorporated, for the design completion and installation of technology at the Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building for the Judiciary Gunshot Detection Program (JGDP).

On October 25, 2021, the Judiciary received a Homeland Security Grant in the amount of \$109,000.00 for the installation of Phase II of the Judiciary Gunshot Detection Program (JGDP) at Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. The JGDP is a multiple phase project to install technology at both buildings to create a notification system that will utilize gunshot detection technology to monitor the report of live gunfire and to send out an alarm to first responders, Judiciary employees, and the public anywhere within these two buildings. Phase II of the JGDP will cost \$109,000.00.

Phase II of the JGDP will involve installing seventeen gunshot detection devices and forty one public address speakers in Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. The JGDP is also designed to take advantage of another ongoing multiple phase project called the Courthouse Security Camera Surveillance System (Camera System) for Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. The Camera System is also funded with Homeland Security Grants from fiscal years 2012, 2014, 2016, 2018, and 2020. Once installed, the JGDP will be integrated into the existing Camera System to maximize the security capabilities and potential of each system. If a gunshot is detected, the JGDP will send an alert to the software automatically displaying preprogrammed building floor plans on a monitor showing the exact location of the incident. Corresponding camera(s) in the area turn on allowing law enforcement to view the situation and determine the appropriate response. Also, by joining these two projects together, the cost for the state and federal governments will be significantly lowered than conducting them separately. Utilizing the existing design of the Camera System and the JGDP and running both infrastructures at the same time will reduce overall costs.

The Camera System is currently managed by the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) of the State of Hawai`i. Phases I, Phase II, and Phase III of the Camera System installation occurred in 2016, 2018, and 2020 respectively. The project is still ongoing with Phase III finishing in 2022. SRP was awarded the contract to install the cameras and all related software for Phases I, II and III. In addition, SRP was awarded the contract to install all technology for Phase I of the JGDP. SRP possesses intimate knowledge and the expertise necessary to effectively install Phase II of the JGDP and to integrate those devices in the existing Camera System as well as the JGDP. In addition, SRP is the only company in Hawai`i authorized, certified and trained to service and maintain the software associated to the Camera System and the JGDP. SRP currently holds the maintenance contract for the Camera System and has consistently performed well during service and repair work since 2006. Therefore, SRP stands in a position to leverage that experience and knowledge for a cost savings for the Judiciary.
