ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS APPEAL

(By: Ginoza, Chief Judge, Leonard and McCullen, JJ.)

Upon consideration of the Stipulation for Dismissal
With Prejudice (**Stipulation**), filed February 24, 2022, by
Plaintiff-Appellee Wilmington Trust, National Association, not in
Its Individual Capacity but Solely in Its Capacity as Trustee of
MFRA Trust 2015-1, the papers in support, and the record, it
appears that:

- (1) the appeal has been docketed;
- (2) the parties stipulate to dismiss the appeal with
prejudice;
- (3) the Stipulation is dated and signed by counsel for
all parties appearing in the appeal;
- (4) the record reflects that appellate filing fees were
paid;

(5) the Stipulation does not specify the terms as to payment of costs, as set forth in Hawai'i Rules of Appellate Procedure (**HRAP**) Rule 42(b); and

(6) because the requirements for a stipulation under HRAP Rule 42(b) have not been met, we construe the Stipulation as a motion under HRAP Rule 42(b).

Therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the motion to dismiss is granted and the appeal is dismissed with prejudice.
