<p>What are the steps for an attorney or self-represented party to request a remote hearing in your circuit?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. - Circuit Court hearings, both criminal and civil, except for evidentiary hearings and trials are available remotely. - Evidentiary hearings and trials can be remote on a case-by-case basis and with the approval of all the parties and judge. 	<p><u>Wailuku & Rural Courts (Lahaina, Molokai, Lanai, Hana):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. - District Court hearings both criminal and civil, except for evidentiary, pre-trial and trial, are all available remotely. - However, can be remote on a case-by-case basis and with approval of all the parties and judge. - Parties/defendants can appear either remotely or in-person. 	<p><u>Wailuku:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. - Parties are able to call and request to appear remotely; Family Court does not automatically set hearings remotely. - For evidentiary, trial, pre-trial, contested hearings, party would need to file an ex-parte motion or motion to be heard remotely. This needs to be granted by the judge. - FC-DA proceedings the petitioner may appear remotely and the respondent is to appear-in person. <p><u>Rural Courts (Molokai, Lanai):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If traveling to these locations, in-person appearances are available. - If not traveling, similar procedure followed as Wailuku.

Which hearings are automatically set for remote hearings?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Courtrooms are open for everyone to attend in person. - Physical appearance may be waived by consent but that is done on a case-by-case basis. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - District Court proceeding both criminal and civil are available remotely. - Evidentiary, pre-trial, trial are not available remotely and are heard in-person. However, can be remote on a case-by-case basis and with approval of all the parties and judge. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - None
If a hearing is set for remote, what does one need to do if he/she would like to attend in person?	Courtrooms are open for everyone to attend in person. However, if you are exhibiting any symptoms of COVID, we ask that you appear via Zoom.	District Court hearings are available both in-person and remotely.	Family Court matters are held in-person.
