ORDER DENYING PETITION

Upon consideration of the April 11, 2023 submission by Julie Smith and its supporting documents, filed with this court as a petition for a writ of mandamus, we conclude, with regard to the claims asserted against all parties, that Smith has failed to demonstrate a clear and indisputable right to relief from this court, or the lack of an alternate remedy, or both. See Straub Clinic & Hosp. v. Kochi, 81 Hawai'i 410, 414, 917 P.2d 1284, 1288 (1996). With regard to the Petitioner's complaint against the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC), we conclude Smith failed to demonstrate that ODC has abused its discretion.
