- (1) Respondent-Appellant RN filed the notice of appeal through standby counsel;
- (2) The statement of jurisdiction and opening brief were due on extension on or before June 26, 2023;
- (3) RN failed to file either document, or request another extension of time;
- (4) On July 31, 2023, the appellate clerk notified RN that the time for filing the statement of jurisdiction and opening brief had expired, the matter would be called to the court's attention on August 10, 2023, for appropriate action, which could include dismissal of the appeal, under Hawai'i Rules of Appellate Procedure (HRAP) Rules 12.1(e) and 30, and RN could request relief from default by motion. The appellate clerk mailed the notice to RN at his address on record. The United States Postal Service returned the notice as not deliverable; and

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(5) RN has not filed a notice of change of address, as required by HRAP Rule 25(f), and his standby counsel is unable to provide an address for RN. RN took no further action in this appeal.

Therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the appeal is dismissed.
