Section 6:

The JGDP is a multiple phase project to install security technology at both buildings to create a notification system that will utilize gunshot detection technology to monitor the report of live gunfire and to send out an alarm to first responders, Judiciary employees, and the public anywhere within these two buildings. In fiscal years 2019 and 2021, the Judiciary received State of Hawaii Homeland Security Grants for the design and installation of Phase I and Phase II of the JGDP at Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. In fiscal year 2019 and 2021, SRP was granted Chapter 103D, HRS, exemptions to complete the work for Phase I and Phase II of the JGDP because of their extensive expertise and knowledge of the security technology already installed at Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. SRP was able to reuse prior design work with minor modifications from previous work at Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building which brought a cost savings to the State of Hawaii.

As a result of Phase III of the JGDP, additional like security technology will be required to be designed and installed at Ali`iolani Hale and the Kapua`iwa Building. SRP possesses the expertise and knowledge necessary to effectively provide the required detailed design and installation of the security technology required for Phase III of the JGDP. As a result, SRP is able to reuse prior design work with minor modifications from the previous designs and installations for Phase III of the JGDP. In addition, SRP is the only company in Hawaii authorized, certified, and trained to be able to service and maintain the software associated with the security technology already purchased for the JGDP. Therefore, SRP stands in a position to leverage that experience and knowledge for a cost savings for the Judiciary.
