What are the steps for an attorney or self-represented party to request a remote hearing in your circuit?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. - On the record, Judge will order if hearings will be done remotely or not. If party requests during the hearing, court staff will provide the Zoom meeting number directly to the requestor. If all parties are to appear via Zoom, meeting information is provided via e-mail to all parties of the case. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. <p>Traffic/Criminal: Requests may come in via e-mail at legaldocs.5DC@courts.hawaii.gov to the DC Court Clerks. The same clerks attend to requests, providing meeting information for parties attending remotely. Attorney is to make request for their client (and or themselves) and provide meeting information to their client if granted.</p> <p>District Court Civil: Requests may come in via e-mail at legaldocs.5DC@courts.hawaii.gov. DC Civil clerk will forward request to Courtroom for Judge review/approval. If approved, courtroom staff provide meeting information to requestor. Attorney is to make request for their client (and or themselves) and provide meeting information to their client if granted.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No form utilized to set a remote hearing. - Currently, all requests for remote hearings are submitted in writing via e-mail. Judge will review reason and if approved, court staff will be provided meeting information to requestor. Attorney is to make request for their client (and or themselves) and provide meeting information to their client if granted. - Pro Se or Self Represented Litigants may email the Court via email at legaldocs.5CC@courts.hawaii.gov. The Legal Document Section will forward the email to appropriate Courtroom for review. If approved, courtroom staff will provide meeting information to requestor. - Court asks all parties to request 72 hours in advance of hearing to attend hearing remotely.
