Upgrading the current FTR recording system, and integrating with hardware to provide audio and video recording of court proceedings, and provide video conferencing in Courtrooms 4, 5, and 9 located at Ka`ahumanu Hale.

6. Explain in detail why it is not practicable or not advantageous for the Program/Division to procure by competitive means:

AVCO installed the original FTR recording system to the courtrooms located at Ka`ahumanu Hale. We are currently seeking to upgrade 3 courtrooms only as those systems seem to be failing. The upgrade will enhance the quality of the video and audio connections for courtroom proceedings. The FTR recording systems are critical to court records. AVCO is uniquely qualified to deliver the specialized expertise required to integrate audio and video components, enabling the effective use of the FTR system for digital recording or courtroom proceedings. Given the critical nature of judicial proceedings and the Judiciary's growing emphasis on digital court recording, it is imperative that the selected vendor is capable, fully qualified and trained to provide, install, service and maintain the FTR recording system. It is advantageous to have one party responsible for the proper functioning of the recording system. Allowing another vendor to work on our system exposes the Judiciary to potential multi-vendor conflicts which may impair the functioning and efficiency of the recording system at Ka'ahumanu Hale; therefore, it is not practicable or not advantageous to procure by competitive means.

7. Explain in detail, the process that will be or was utilized in selecting the vendor/contractor/service provider:

AVCO was the original installer of the FTR recording system and is familiar with the system at Ka'ahumanu Hale. AVCO understands the challenges of securing the FTR recording system at Ka'ahumanu Hale and has the knowledge, expertise and background in the building's infrastructure to ensure there are no disruptions to courtroom proceedings.
