AVCO installed the original FTR recording system to the courtrooms located at Ka'ahumanu Hale. We are currently seeking to upgrade 3 courtrooms only as those systems seem to be failing. The upgrade will enhance the quality of the video and audio connections for courtroom proceedings. The FTR recording systems are critical to court records. AVCO is uniquely qualified to deliver the specialized expertise required to integrate audio and video components, enabling the effective use of the FTR system for digital recording or courtroom proceedings. Given the critical nature of judicial proceedings and the Judiciary's growing emphasis on digital court recording, it is imperative that the selected vendor is capable, fully qualified and trained to provide, install, service and maintain the FTR recording system. It is advantageous to have one party responsible for the proper functioning of the recording system.
