#### Section 3:

The details related to this request are for the provision, installation, service and continuous monitoring of an estimated seventy-six (76) home alarm packages related to the Judiciary Home Alarm Package Program (JHAPP). The costs are estimated at this time to not exceed amount of \$975,000.00 and detailed as follows:

- 1. Installation of an estimated seventy-six (76) home alarm systems
- 2. Monthly home alarm system monitoring services for a year for an estimated seventy-six (76) alarm packages estimated at \$149.00 a month for full term of this exemption for all of the estimated seventy-six (76) home alarm systems for twelve (12) months each.

## Section 6:

Approval is respectfully requested for an exemption from Chapter 103D, HRS, to acquire the professional services of Alert Alarm of Hawaii to provide equipment and services for an estimated seventy-six (76) home alarm packages for Judiciary Justices and Judges who have been evaluated at an elevated risk of targeted violence at their residence as a result of their official duties. The home alarm packages would be an expansion and continuation of the Judiciary Home Alarm Package Program (JHAPP). The JHAPP is a statewide home alarm package program deployed across the state for Judiciary employees who have been evaluated at an elevated risk of targeted violence at their residence as a result of their official duties.

In 2023, the Judiciary created the JHAPP with Alert Alarm of Hawaii. Recent politically motivated violence across the United States, as well as direct threat towards Judiciary Justices and Judges, has elevated the risk of targeted violence at their residence for members of Federal, State and Local Government, to include Judiciary Justices and Judges.

Alert Alarm of Hawaii is the only established alarm company that could provide statewide services to the Judiciary for these services for the JHAPP:

- Alert Alarm of Hawaii is the only statewide alarm company with a UL certified call center in the State of Hawaii that could offer twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week, three hundred and sixty-five (365) days a year of service.
- Alert Alarm of Hawaii is the only statewide alarm company authorized by the Hawaii
  Department of Law Enforcement to integrate into the Department's system and is
  the only vendor that is authorized to have a direct fiber optic connection to the State
  of Hawaii network for colocation.
- Alert Alarm of Hawaii is the only statewide alarm company that is presently authorized to integrate the Judiciary's JHAPP into the State of Hawaii network for integration with the Hawaii Department of Law Enforcement when necessary.

With the procurement of these services for the home alarm packages from Alert Alarm of Hawaii as offered which meet Judiciary specifications, Alert Alarm of Hawaii would be the only company which could provide the specified monitoring services for the purchased alarm systems, the installation services for the purchased alarm systems, the removal services for the purchased alarm system, with potential integration to the Hawaii Department of Law Enforcement.
