ORDER AMENDING THE HAWAI‘I RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE
(By: Devens, C.J., McKenna, Eddins, and Ginoza, JJ., and
Intermediate Court of Appeals Chief Judge Nakasone,
assigned by reason of vacancy)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Rules 6 and 77 of the Hawai‘i
Rules of Civil Procedure are amended, effective July 1, 2026, as
follows (deleted material is bracketed and stricken; new
material is underscored):

Rule 6. TIMES.

(a) Computation. In computing any period of time prescribed
or allowed by these rules, by order of court, or by any applicable statute,
the day of the act, event, or default after which the designated period of
time begins to run shall not be included. The last day of the period so

computed shall be included unless it is a Saturday, a Sunday or a holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not a Saturday, a Sunday or a holiday. When the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than 7 days, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall be excluded in the computation. As used in ~~[this rule]~~ these rules, "holiday" ~~[includes]~~ shall mean any day designated as such pursuant to section 8-1 of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes.

Rule 77. CIRCUIT COURTS AND CLERKS.

(c) **Clerk's office and orders by clerk.** The clerk's office with the clerk or a deputy in attendance shall be open during business hours on all days except Saturdays, Sundays and ~~[legal]~~ holidays. All motions and applications in the clerk's office for issuing mesne process, for issuing final process to enforce and execute judgments, for entering defaults or judgments by default, and for other proceedings which do not require allowance or order of the court are grantable ~~[of course]~~ by the clerk; but the clerk's action may be suspended or altered or rescinded by the court upon cause shown.
